REQUESTING THE DA PLANNING AND MONITORING SERVICE (DA - PMS) AND DA FINANCE AND MANAGEMENT SERVICE (DA - FMS) TO IMPLEMENT THE AMOUNT OF ONE BILLION PESOS (PhP1,000,000,000.00) FOR NATIONAL ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PROGRAM (NOAP) FOR INCLUSION IN THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET FOR FY2023 PURSUANT TO SECTION 26 OF RA 11511

WHEREAS, pursuant to Republic Act 10068, as amended, otherwise known as the "Amended Organic Agriculture Act of 2010", the law established the National Organic Agriculture Program;

WHEREAS, RA 10068 has been amended by RA 11511, and Section 2 thereof states to the effect, that the State reaffirms its policy to promote, propagate, develop further, and implement the practice of organic agriculture in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, the National Organic Agriculture Board (NOAB) is the policy-making body mandated under Section 6 of RA 10068, as amended, to provide direction and general guidelines for the implementation of the NOAP;

WHEREAS, Section 26 RA 11511 states that, "The Department of Budget and Management shall include annually in the President's program of expenditure for submission to and approval by Congress One Billion pesos (PhP1,000,000,000) for the promotion and development of the National Organic Agriculture Program."

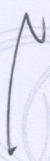
WHEREAS, Only Php512 Million representing Tier 1 for FY 2023 was allocated for NOAP which is substantially below the One (1) Billion allocation for the Program as mandated in RA 11511;

WHEREAS, Under the "Proposed Programmatic Approach and Policy-Based Loan for Subprogram I, Republic of the Philippines: Climate Change Policy Program", the Philippines through the NOAP, has committed the establishment of at least three (3) Organic Agriculture Hubs covering crop, livestock, and/or fisheries, with focus on domestic market and climate resiliency.

WHEREAS, the Program recognizes the need of the Department to provide funds for multiple programs. However, the Program also needs sufficient funding to deliver its target;

WHEREAS, the Program has ready projects and activities that are in line with the "OneDA" approach, that will address the needs of organic agriculture practitioners and stakeholders;

WHEREAS, the DA Planning and Monitoring Service (DA - PMS) and Finance and Management Service (DA - FMS) are responsible for the preparation of the DA annual budget for endorsement to the Secretary of Agriculture, and subsequently for submission and approval by the Congress;
